DRYER VENT MAINTENANCE POLICY REVISED AUGUST 4, 2019

For the purpose of fire prevention, the Village at Mount Hope Bay Condominium Association (VMHBCA), through its Board of Directors, has established the responsibility of each unit owner to arrange for an inspection and cleaning (if needed) of any clothes dryer vents in his/her unit on a biennial basis. Inspections and cleanings must be done by either:

1. A person or firm experienced in dryer vent inspection and cleaning who carries the necessary liability insurance required to perform work at the VMHBCA.
2. An individual homeowner, provided that they have full access to the vent opening on both ends (supply and discharge) and have the means to properly service the cleaning of the vent.
 - a. Note that at no time are homeowners allowed on rooftops or above the first floor via ladders or scaffolding or similar equipment for the purpose of accessing vent pipe openings
 - b. Homeowners performing their own inspection and cleaning must sign an Affirmation (attached) stating that the work was done properly.

For those using a vendor, each unit owner is responsible for providing evidence of the inspection and the cleaning (if the inspection indicates cleaning is needed). Evidence can be a receipt or statement on company letterhead.

Documentation must be submitted by December 31st of odd numbered years. If evidence is not provided, the unit owner will be in violation of the Association's Rules and Regulations and subject to penalties by the Association.

The unit owner is free to use any person or company that meets the requirements above. The VMHBCA does not endorse any specific vendor, but these services may be available to owners from:
